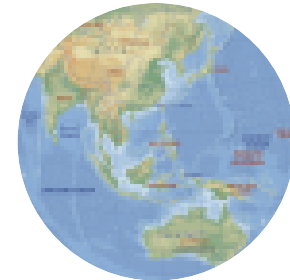

## India

While pursuing his higher education in 1937 Dr James as a Hindu witnessed a moving sight of a humanitarian act of an English lady tenderly dressing the sores of an Indian orphan lad and speaking loving words and concern and reassurance to the poor boy and this compelled him to give serious thought to Christianity.

Dr James writes in one of his books "I knew that many of my own fellow Indians would not bring themselves to do such an act of tender care and love. It dawned on me then that Christianity did not consist of pious word and rituals but it was kindness personified. Little wonder that later I was drawn to Christianity and saluted the Lord Jesus Christ as my personal saviour - unconditionally surrendering my affection and allegiance to Him".

The life and work of our Lord Jesus Christ made a great impact on Dr James as he saw how the Lord supported the needy as well as preached the gospel. Jesus healed the sick, fed the hungry and cast out demons. But this is only a means to an end. The ultimate object is to proclaim the glorious Good News of the kingdom.

In profound thanksgiving to God and much appreciation of Dr James' faithful ministry as a full time missionary/evangelist for more than half a century, his loved ones and Christian friends who have been signally blessed by Dr James' ministry over the years, initiated the G D James Foundation in April 1996.

The purpose of the Foundation is to generate and manage funds to support national missionaries and social work in the two-thirds world as well as in Australia, New Zealand and the Pacific Islands.



430 poor children are taught in 9 classes in the Jesus School at Dhamodara Village 35 km from Varanasi in Uttar Pradesh.



Nearly 1,200 children are reached every year through the Vacation Bible School conducted for 8-10 days for 4 hours a day during holidays in the slums of Mumbai.



In North East India the Home for Street Children looks after 40 orphans who are given spiritual nurture and regular education.



## Vietnam



Orphans are cared for at Gia La Province, about 500km from Saigon on the Central Highlands and Lam Dong Province, about 300km From Saigon. The tribal people are from the Koho Tribe and there are more than 60,000 Koho believers, most of them meeting secretly in house churches (which are illegal), with services starting as early as 4am or 5am to avoid detection by the authorities.



## Nepal

Since the Maoists attacks, over 2,000 children have become orphans and compelled to live in caves and on the streets. Grace Rescue Home started in 2003 has been instrumental in caring for many of these homeless kids and giving them education through the Grace Educational Centre, which provides quality education based on Christian value. There are nearly 200 children studying at Grace Educational Centre.
